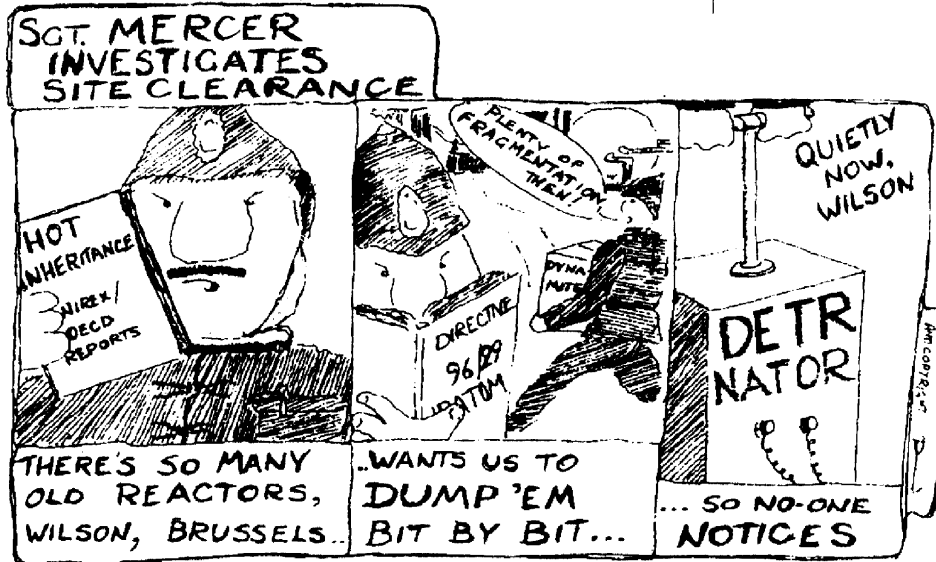
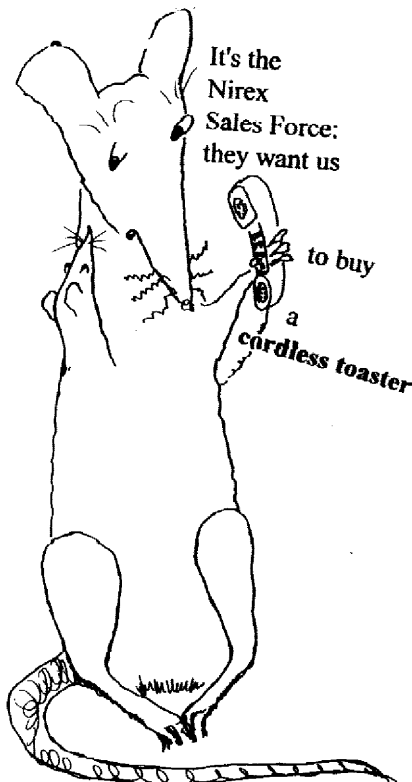


This dates from 1998 when the Low Level Radiation Campaign was persuading the Department of Environment, Transport and the Regions (DETR) not to implement aspects of a European Directive (96/29/EURATOM - the Basic Safety Standards Directive) that explicitly allowed contaminated materials to be cleared from nuclear installations and recycled into consumer goods.
